


Welcoming Two New Families!

What a joy it is whenever our church is full with worshippers. Our own Pastor John also blessed us with a special song that day to close his sermon.


Following the service a number of the choir and band members and their families. It was a delightful day!

In January the church met in business session to review the 2018 membership report and vote on several items of business, not the least of all the air conditioning bids submitted for replacing our ailing A/C units.

Air Conditioning Update:

It was the consensus of the members present to award the Dynamo Company the project. At the February Church Board Meeting it was announced that the other bidding company, BWR, had come back with a more appealing offer. After sharing the offer with Dynamo, they agreed to match the offer from BWR, so the contract has been awarded to Dynamo and work is expected to begin on March 18.

Church Budget News:

In 2018 we met 86.9% of our budget. This is the best giving record our church has achieved for several years. Let's all work hard in 2019 to make 100% of our financial needs.

Church Officers Report:

A number of ministries are active in our Norco Church family. Jaime Platas has agreed to serve as an elder along with the team of Rocio Castellanos and Robert and Julie Morena Diaz and Jaime Sanchez are leading the deacons team in service to our church.

Prayer Ministries is being led by Jaime and Christine Platas, and they are also coordinating our Fellowship dinners the first and third Sabbaths of the month. The Hospitality Committee covers the duties on the second and fourth Sabbaths.










Pathfinders – Service and Socials

Raising funds for the trip to Oshkosh for the Pathfinder Camporee!


